Kyrie eleison: Persistence in Prayer

Two characters step out of scripture today to teach us about persistence in prayer. One is named. Jacob is the devious brother who tricked his twin, Esau, out of his birthright and their father's blessing, and Jacob was himself duped on his wedding night by his father-in-law, Laban. The other character, unnamed, is a widow acquainted with grief, one among many marginalized and vulnerable people, but a woman who dares to stand her ground in her quest for justice. On the banks of the river Jabbok, Jacob wrestles with the angel and limps away with a blessing and a new identity. The unnamed widow repeatedly appeals for justice and finally is vindicated. Many have known persistent prayer as a kind of wrestling with God. Many have pleaded with God for justice and mercy. Today God's grace and mercy is known in the blessing of baptismal remembrance and our identity as beloved children of God.

Save us, O God, for the waters are rising, and there is no firm place to stand. Life as we know it has been swept away. Draw near to us in this time of need and be our protection. Support us as we rebuild what has been ruined. Do not let us drown in our sorrow, but raise us to new life in your promise of rebirth, already claimed for us in Jesus Christ, our Savior and Lord. Lutheran Disaster Response / Situation Report: Pakistan Flooding



Since June 2022, Pakistan has experienced historic monsoon weather, with rainfall leading to torrential flooding. The flooding is causing a widespread humanitarian crisis, with people losing homes, crops and livestock. Millions of people are displaced and in need of humanitarian assistance, such as food, temporary shelter, health services and other supplies.

Lutheran Disaster Response is contributing to an <u>appeal from</u> <u>ACT Alliance</u> to address the monsoon flooding in Pakistan. The implementing partner, Community World Service Asia (CWSA)

will provide cash assistance so impacted families can buy food and other needs. CWSA is also setting up mobile health clinics to address health needs and will help communities build the capacity to construct flood-resilient homes. The homes are being built by local laborers involved as part of a cash for work program.

Listening to others: an essential element of mission



How do we, as Christians, understand our mission today? How to we respond to Christ's great commission at the end of Matthew's gospel to 'go and make disciples of all nations?"

That question was at the heart of a greeting by the Lutheran World Federation (LWF) General Secretary Rev. Anne Burghardt to the Association of Protestant

Churches and Missions in Germany (Evangelische Mission Weltweit, EMW) at their annual General Assembly in Hamburg.

It is our task, she said, to pass on what our Lord Jesus Christ commanded us to do: to share with others the Good News of our liberation, to serve fellow human beings, to respect the dignity of other and to work for reconciliation.

In carrying out this task, Burghardt noted, "we should always be aware that even mission understood in this way can only succeed if we are willing to listen to others. Listening is the unspoken element of the great mission commandment, she emphasized, because without it, "there is no understanding, no empathy and ultimately no acceptance." (READ MORE)

Attention to U.S. Hunger at White House Conference

When the ELCA signed a request of President Biden to host a White House Conference on Food, Nutrition, Hunger, and Health, the group of organizations stated: "We *can* end hunger in America, and a public commitment to a White House Conference, with ending hunger as a key priority, is an essential step in accomplishing this goal" (March 14, 2022 <u>Letter</u>). The conference sponsored by the White House on September 28 became the second of its kind in over half a century. Tackling hunger, nutrition and health in America was the theme, accompanied by the announced *Biden-Harris Administration National Strategy on Hunger, Nutrition, and Health.*

The vision of ELCA World Hunger is nothing short of a just world where all are fed.

Hunger in the United States

Mission Memo 575

According to the White House data on hunger, nutrition and health, <u>1 in 10</u> <u>American households experience food insecurity</u>. Additionally, diet-related diseases are some of the leading causes of death in the United States of America: <u>10% of Americans have diabetes</u>, 1 in 3 Americans will have cancer in their lifetime, and more than <u>40% of Americans suffer from high blood pressure</u>. These grim statistics disproportionately affect communities of color, <u>people living</u> in rural areas, people living in U.S. territories, people with disabilities, older adults, <u>LGBT community members</u>, <u>military families and veterans</u>. It is with this landscape that the work being done by government programs such as Supplemental Nutrition Assistance Program (SNAP); Special Supplemental Nutrition Program for Women, Infants, and Children (WIC); school meals and Child Tax Credits (CTC) is important for meeting basic needs. Among <u>ELCA federal policy prioritization</u> is supporting the strength and reach of these programs.
