10		each other; therefore, be it

12	RESOLVED,	that the Synod Council establish a voluntary round-robin congregational audit process,
13		whereby a congregation would be encouraged to submit to an audit by a team from
14		another synod congregation, using the guidelines recommended by the Evangelical
15		Lutheran Church in America and would, in turn, provide an audit team to audit another
16 17		participating congregation using the same guidelines; and be it further
17 18	DESOLVED	that congregations that participate in the round robin guidit process and complete and
16 19	RESOLVED,	that congregations that participate in the round robin audit process and complete and pass their audit be recognized and celebrated by the Synod Council and Synod
